My dear Henderson

I telephoned to Sinclair this even and told them to make another enlargement from the right negative and send it on to you. Your parcel safely to hand. I have spent a most pleasant evening examining the contents. One sedge is certainly new, namely *Grammatoulius atomarius* and I am glad to have it as it is the only specimen in fluid I have seen. (it is the big light coloured sedge from Brooks). Overleaf I have copied out the complete list.

I have only obtained estimates from Earles for actual list it works out at 68/8 per ton which I suffer is owe to heavy railway freight. I have made enquires in London from the associated cement manufacturers and can get it delivered from them at under 40/s to Mottisfont. They tell me that I shall have to use one part in five which of course brings up the price compared to your one part in six.

Still no rain in Dunbridge and still no nice rise. I killed a fish of 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ on Dixan water at his request. Returned another of the same weight. Smaller ones, nothing sizable at all. I am writing to your son Malcom asking him to come up for a weekend. I am anxious to make his acquaintance. Hope conditions will be more favourable when he comes up, probably end of July or August, here is the list of flies,
